# **Pronunciation Lesson 2**

In this lesson, you will learn the following new sounds:

Initials	z, c
Finals	a, eo aai, ai, ei, oi, ui, eoi
Tones	Tone 3 (mid level)

# 1~ Tone 3 (Mid Level)

Tone 3 is the mid level tone. The pitch remains at the middle pitch throughout the whole syllable. The pitch of Tone 3 is slightly lower than the pitch of Tone 1.







Immediately lower the blade of your tongue a little to create a narrow gap between the blade of your tongue and your alveolar ridge. Blow out air through the narrow gap softly.







Immediately lower the blade of your tongue a little to create a narrow gap between the blade of your tongue and your alveolar ridge. Blow out a large amount of air through the narrow gap to create a noticeable sound of breathing out.

Initial z	[ts]	<i>j</i> as in <i>jump</i> Note that the initial z and the <i>j</i> sound in <i>jump</i> are not identical. When we say the <i>j</i> sound in <i>jump</i> , we round our lips. However, when we say the initial z, we don't round our lips.
Initial c	[tsʰ]	t + s as in cats The initial c is similar to the ending sound of a word ending with t and the plural s.

# 4 ~ The Final a


The final a is formed by the vowel a alone. Note that the final a only appears in very few words.

$$a - a - a - a - a$$

**Tongue Position:** Open your mouth a little by lowering your lower jaw a little.

Lower the front of your tongue a little.

**Lip Shape:** Relax your lips. Avoid rounding or spreading them.

### 5 ~ The Vowel eo

The vowel eo doesn't form a final on its own. It is always combined with another vowel or an ending consonant to form a final. Also, note that the vowel eo is not produced by combining the vowel e and the vowel o. It is a sound different from both of them.
