Cantonese Sound	Aspiration
Initial gw	Unaspirated
Initial kw	Aspirated ㄟ

The initials gw and kw are similar to the initials g and k combined with the initial w respectively.

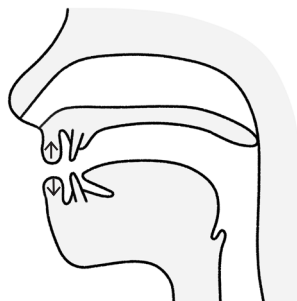

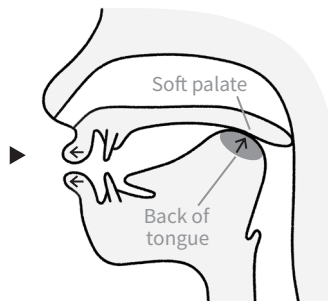

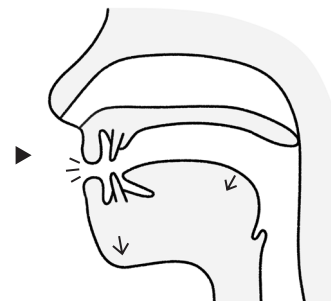
Soft palate
The back of the roof
of your mouth



Open your mouth a little.



Raise the back of your tongue to your soft palate quickly. You will feel your whole tongue move backward. While moving your tongue, round your lips. Your lips will move forward.



Immediately lower the back of your tongue by lowering your lower jaw a little and unround your lips. Avoid blowing out a large amount of air.

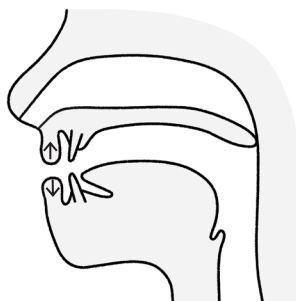

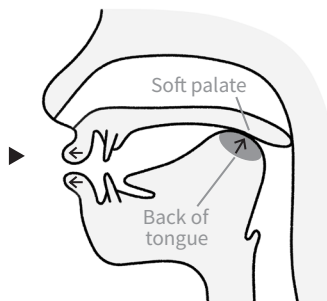

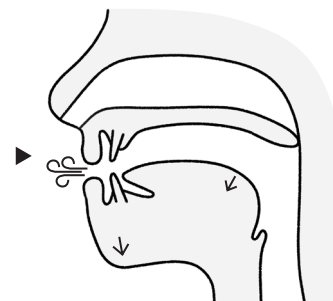
Soft palate
The back of the roof
of your mouth



Open your mouth a little.



Raise the back of your tongue to your soft palate quickly. You will feel your whole tongue move backward. While moving your tongue, round your lips. Your lips will move forward.



Immediately lower the back of your tongue by lowering your lower jaw a little and unround your lips. Blow out a large amount of air to create a noticeable sound of breathing out.

5 ~ The Finals with Only a Consonant

There are two finals which are formed by only one consonant.

m ng

These two finals are never combined with an initial. They always form a syllable on their own. Also, both of them only appear in very few words.

6 ~ The Final m

The final m is formed by the consonant m alone.

 **Step 1**  15 Listen to the final m.

 **Step 2**  16 Listen and repeat.

Move your two lips toward each other quickly until your mouth is completely closed. Don't open your mouth immediately. Keep your mouth closed until the next syllable. The final m is a nasal sound. Let air pass through your nose and come out. You will feel the sound be produced inside your nose.

7 ~ The Final ng

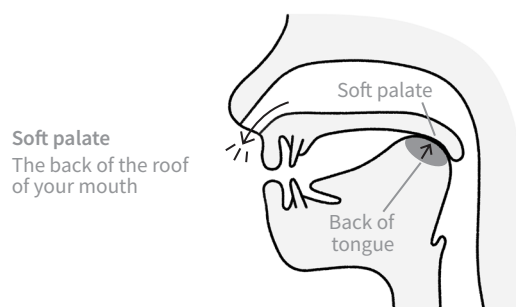
The final ng is formed by the consonant ng alone.

 **Step 1**  18 Listen to the final ng.

Raise the back of your tongue to your soft palate quickly. You will feel your whole tongue move backward. Don't lower the back of your tongue immediately. Keep the back of your tongue at the same position until the next syllable. The final ng is a nasal sound. Let air pass through your nose and come out. You will feel the sound be produced inside your nose.
